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Questions to generate discussions

What do you enjoy studying?

What subjects are you good at?

What advice have your teachers given?

Do you know what job or career you want to do?

Finally, this last question I am going to ask is important.

They have, for the first time, choice.

What they choose now can influence their future pathway

How does their choice affect their future?



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Choice is important

- Some subjects are pre-requisites for certain careers
- Some subjects can only be taken through to A Level if you have studied the subject at GCSE e.g. Languages
- Some universities, apprenticeship providers and employers want specific subjects for degree or other courses/training placements and so making the right choice now is so important
- Universities highly value the **English Baccalaureate** as a measure of academic potential and success
 - **EBacc** = English, Maths, Science, a Language and a Humanity subject (History or Geography)



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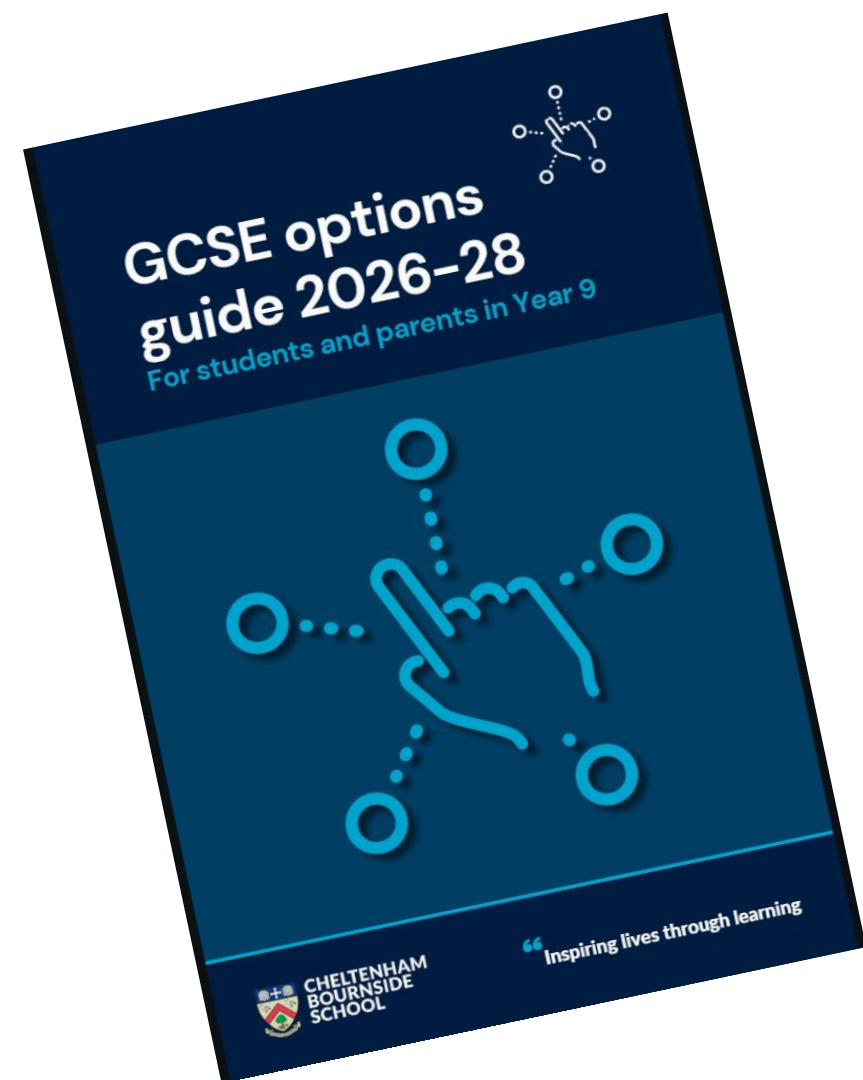

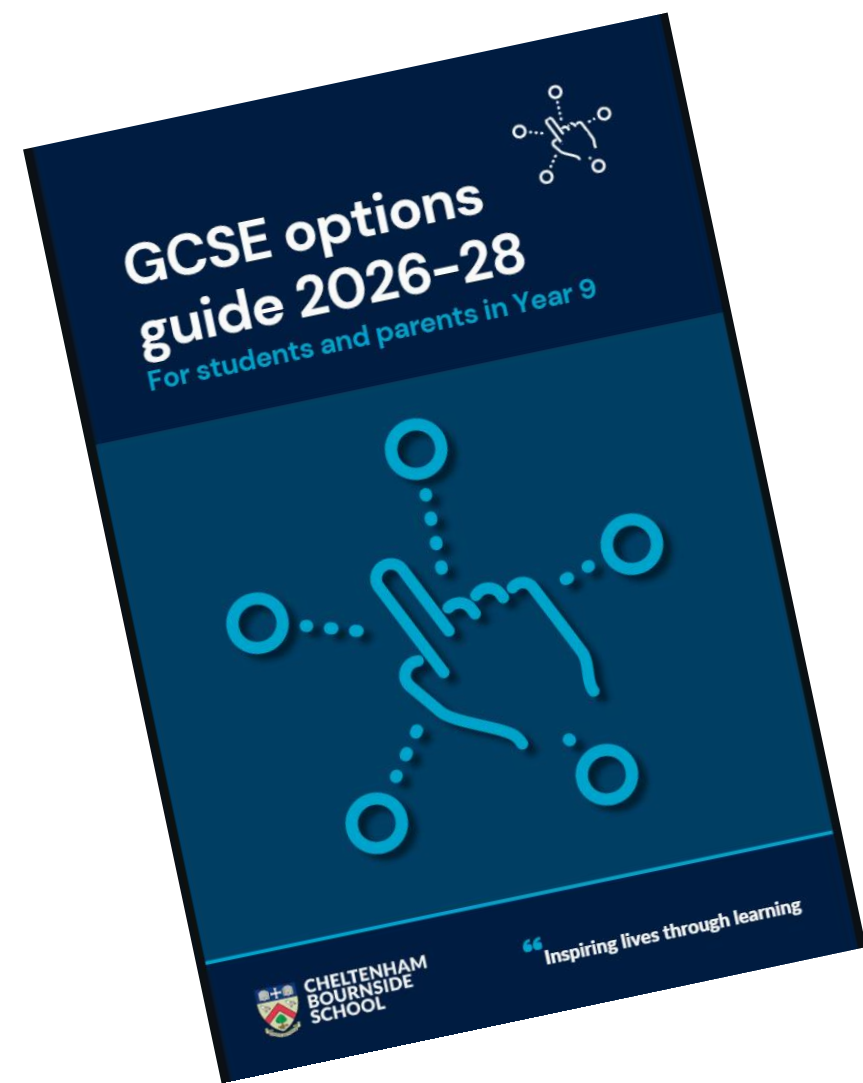

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The Core Subjects

The Core (30 hours per cycle):

- **English Language and Literature GCSEs** (9 hours)
- **Maths GCSE** (8 hours)
- **Science GCSEs** (2/3 GCSEs) (9 or 14 hours)
- **Sport and Games** (not examined) (2 hours)
- **Education for Life and Religion & Worldviews** (not examined) (2 hours)
- Either 5 or 6 GCSEs will be achieved

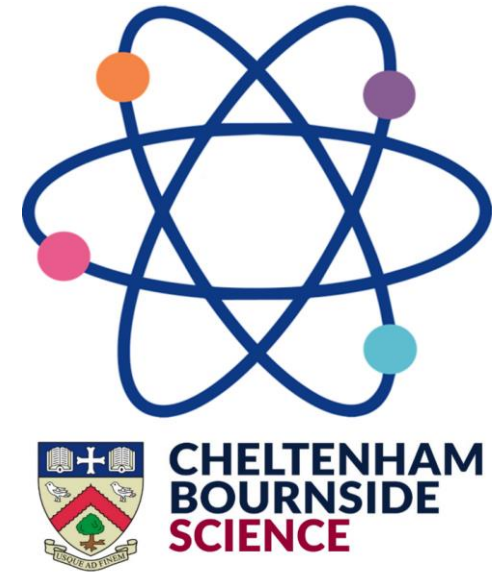


Which route through Science?

GCSE Combined Science – this is the route that most students will follow, where they will gain 2 GCSE grades/qualifications i.e. a Double Science qualification.

GCSE Separate Sciences – you will study three separate sciences leading to GCSEs in Biology, Chemistry and Physics. Separate grades will be achieved for each science. To do this you must chose **Triple Science** as one of your compulsory option choices.

Both routes are suitable preparation for any A Level Science course(s).



Optional Subjects

4 additional subjects from the choice of 31 subjects.
At least **one of the four** must be either:

- History
- Geography
- Triple Science
- Computer Science
- A Modern Foreign Language

Compulsory subjects are **highlighted in gold**. You only need to pick one and this can be from any block. You can pick more than one compulsory subject.



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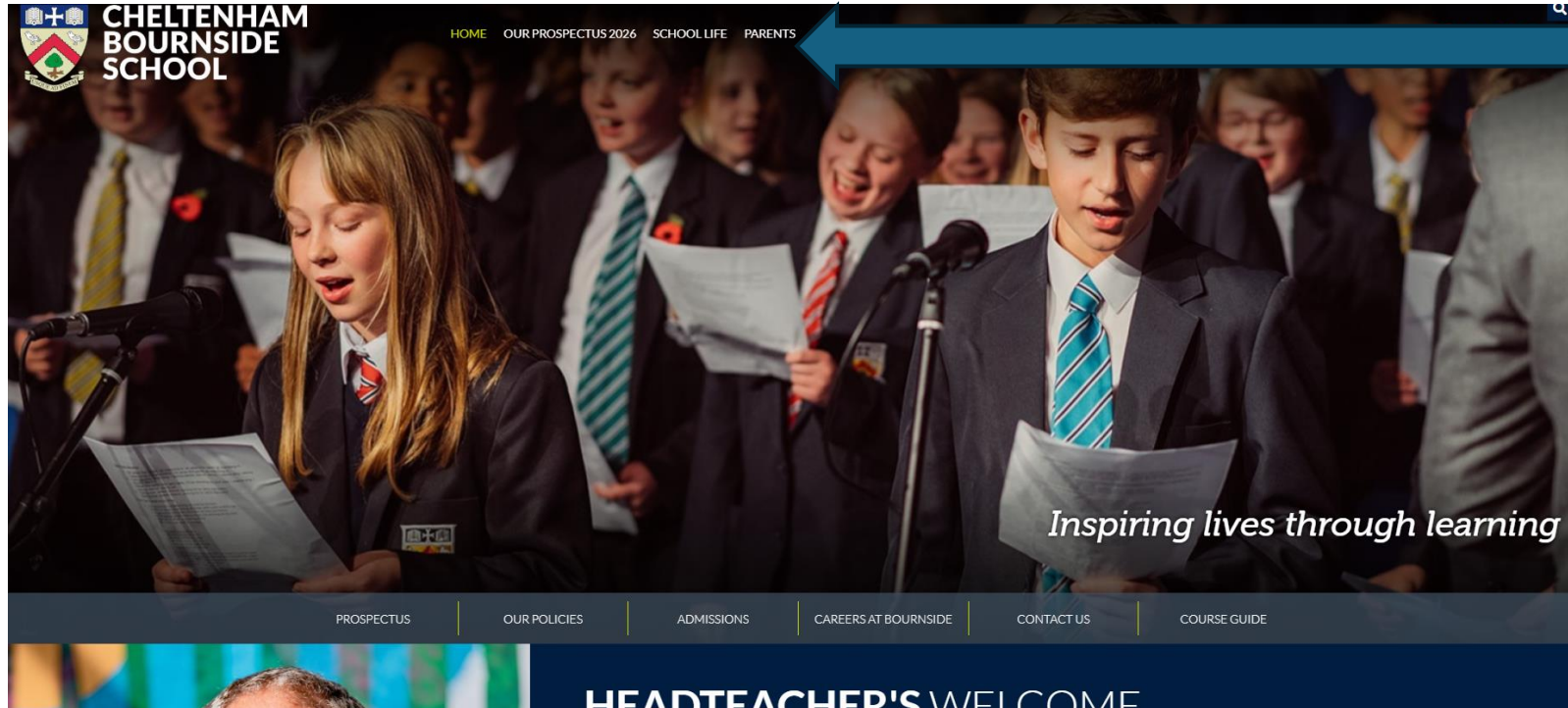

- Read our Sixth Form prospectus – this will go live later this month with an introduction from Mr Warren, our Head of Sixth Form.

Attend the Year 9 PTC in early February with your son/ daughter

What is “Foundation Learning”?

This is a package of support for those students who we identify will:

- Find the full range of GCSEs quite demanding
- Need additional support with literacy and numeracy
- Need additional support accessing Post-16 options
- Benefit from focusing on a skills approach to support future progression

Mrs Lees and Mr Mudge will identify and talk to those students who they believe this course might be suitable for and will be in contact with them.

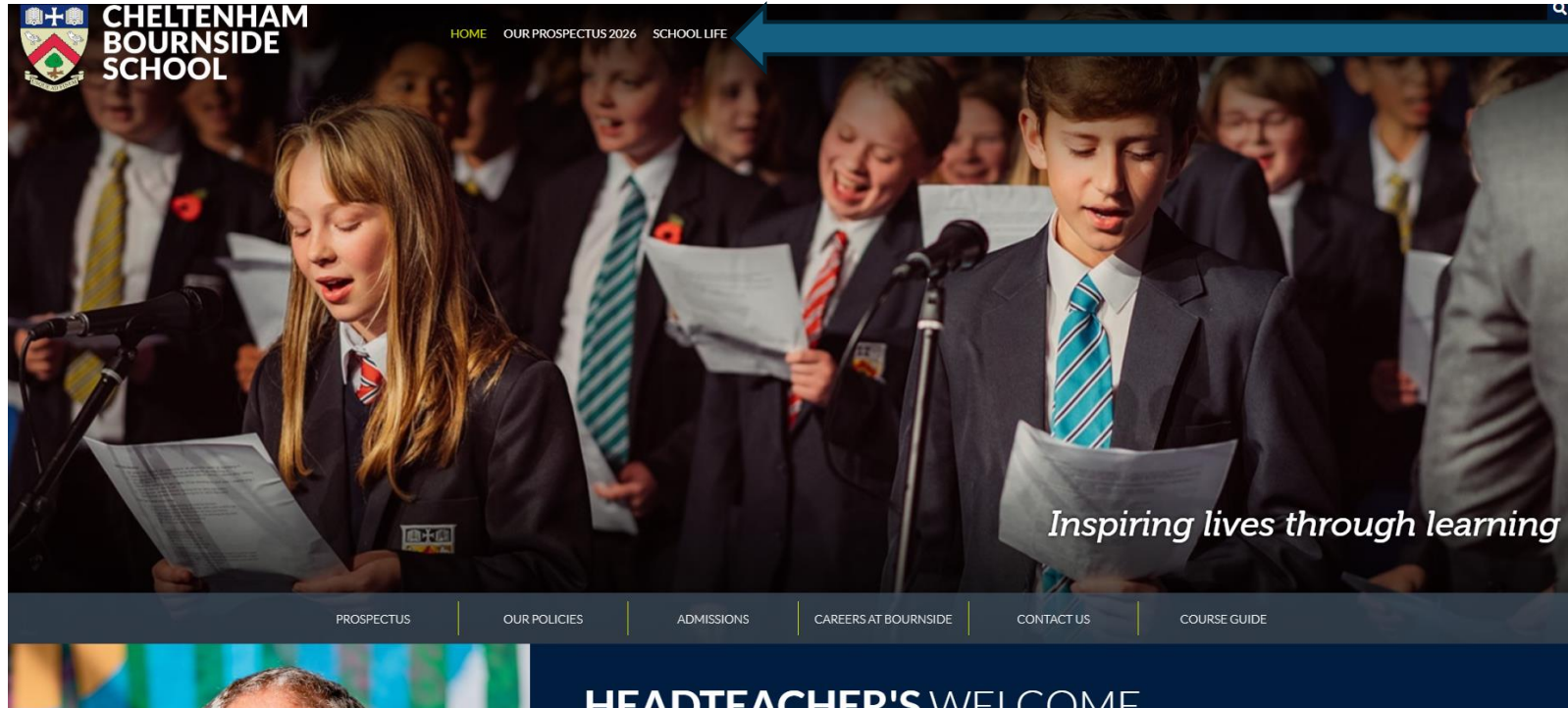
What is a “Pathway”?

It might be that you put a package of options together that might lead to a certain career

1. **Art and Design Pathway** – Fine Art, Media Studies and Creative iMedia
2. **Humanities Pathway** – Geography, History and Religious Studies
3. **Technology Pathway** – Computing, Product Design and Creative iMedia
4. **Healthcare Pathway** – Health & Social Care and Sociology
5. **Languages Pathway** – at least two Language options

Universities prize the **English Baccalaureate** – to get this you would need to study History or Geography and a Modern Foreign Language, alongside English, Maths and Science. When these subjects are added to the Core, this gives you a broad, academic set of options that top universities are often looking for when looking at applications.

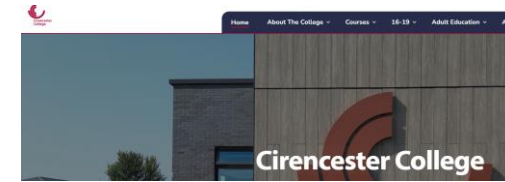
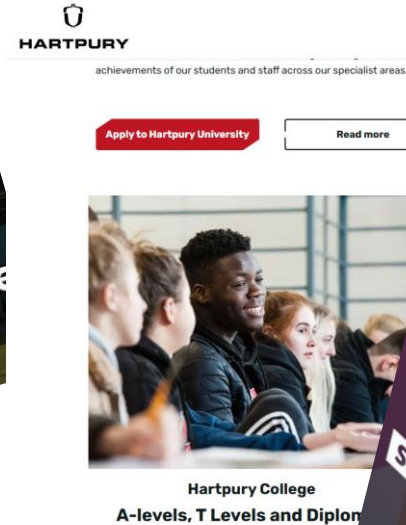
