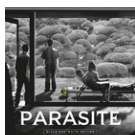

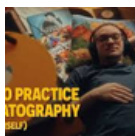
DaVinci Resolve Beginners Tutorial 2025: Edit like a PRO for FREE! This is one of absolutely hundreds of videos. If your laptop/pc will run DaVinci then using these is the best way to develop your skills beyond those allowed within the constraints of lesson time.



NEW to DaVinci Resolve? Color Grading - Tutorial

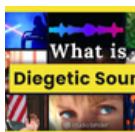
This is the key skill that differentiates top-grade students. This requires a lot of time and patience to get right, but makes the world of difference to the quality of finished films.

Introduction to EDITING THEORY | Continuity Editing, Montage, the Rule of Six, and MORE! Editing is key to understanding the unique nature of film language, we'll concentrate on this in class.

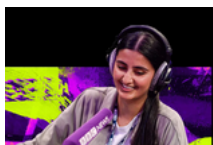
