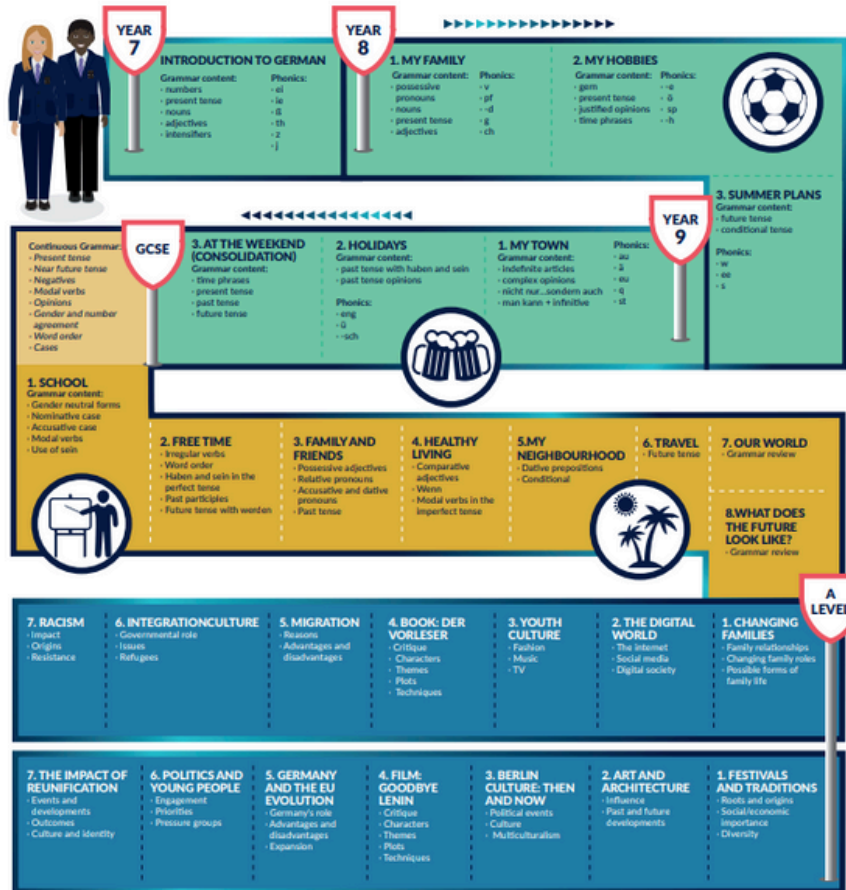

Great for talking about drama and post-war social critique.

Media, politics and terrorism in the 1970s.

Annual translation competition of fiction and non-fiction texts. Speak with your German teacher to take part.



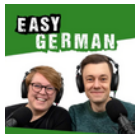
Stephen Spender Poetry Prize

Slow, natural conversations on everyday topics with transcript and vocabulary support.



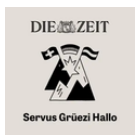
Langsam Gesprochene Nachrichten (DW)

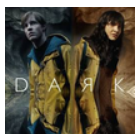

2015 German spy thriller series



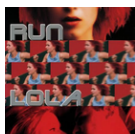
Das Wunder von Bern (The Miracle of Bern)

Directed by Sönke Wortmann. Released 2003.
Set in post-war Germany, following the story of a family and the German nation on its journey to the 1954 World Cup.



Das Boot (The Boat)

Directed by Wolfgang Peterson. Released 1981.
A German submarine crew fights the Allies in 1941.



Lola Rennt (Run Lola Run)

Directed by Tom Tykwer. Released 1998.
Energetic and fast paced – a young woman needs to get 100,000 DMs or her boyfriend will die. Fantastic performance by Franka Potente (she was in The Bourne Identity).



Goodbye Lenin!

Directed by Wolfgang Becker. Released 2003.
A heart-warming comedy set in East Germany about a young man (played by Daniel Brühl) whose socialist mother awakes from a coma, unaware of the recent German reunification.

German-related experiences can include:

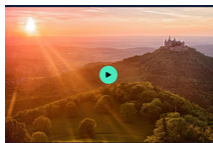
- University tasters, such as the German University Taster on Springpod
