Work Experience and Events



The Politics Department understands the importance of work experience for students wishing to study the subject at University and encourages those who are interested in reading Politics to gain as much experience as possible.

Work experience in politics gives you the chance to see how government and democracy operate beyond the classroom. Whether you're shadowing a councillor, volunteering with a political party, or taking part in youth representation, these opportunities show how political decisions are made and how individuals can influence change.

Politics-related experiences can include:

- Work experience with an MP, such as Max Wilkinson, Liberal Democrat MP for Cheltenham
- Virtual programmes, including Politics Work Experience via Springpod
- Volunteering with political parties, through Young Labour, Young Conservatives or Young Liberals
- Think tanks and charities, such as the Institute for Government or Chatham House
- Local government, for example shadowing councillors at Cheltenham Borough Council
- Youth representation, including the UK Youth Parliament or local youth councils.

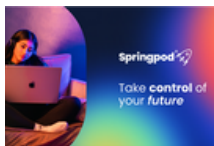
These opportunities help develop communication, critical thinking and leadership skills, while strengthening applications for future study or careers in politics, law, public service or campaigning.
