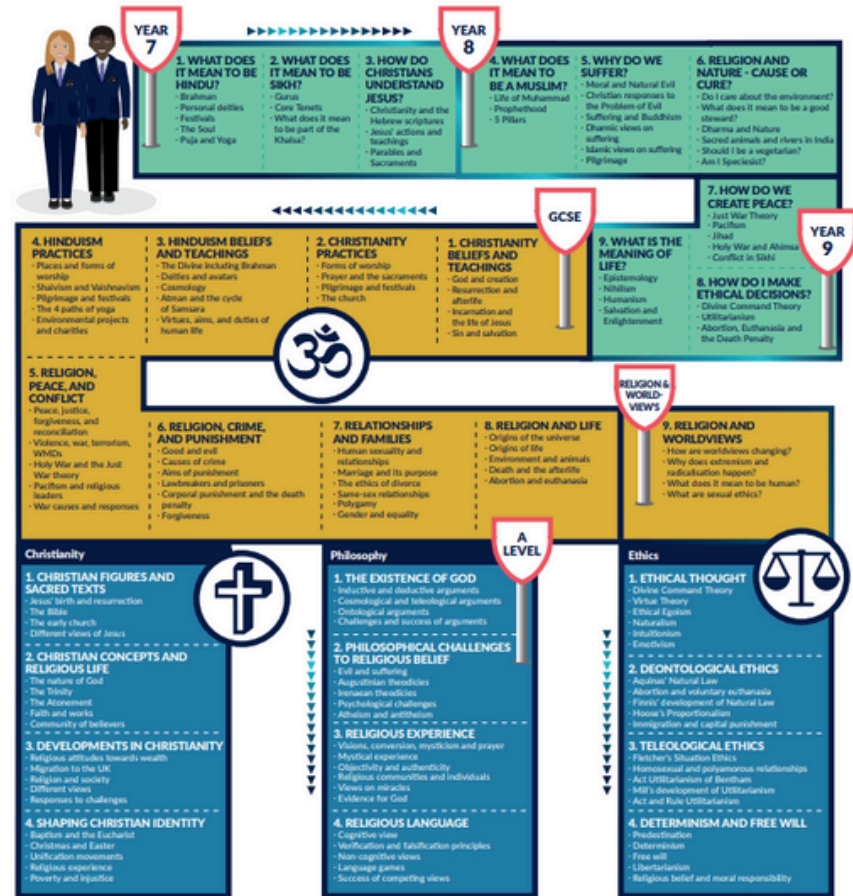

- **Eclipse of Christianity** - *Rupert Shortt* - the decline of the Church in the West and the reason behind it, as well as a study into how Christianity is seemingly thriving in traditionally 'non-Christian' places.
- **Dominion** - *Tom Holland* - an account of how Christianity has both explicitly and implicitly shaped worldviews in the West.
- **The Holy Bible** - It goes without saying that this is a must have for any budding Theologian!
- **Justice: What is the right thing to do?** *Michael Sandel* - an exploration into hotly contested ethical debates and dilemmas, drawing on the work and contributions of ethicists such as Kant, Bentham, Aristotle and Rawles.
- **Revolutionary: Who is Jesus and why does he still matters?** - *Tom Holland*
A collection of essays reflecting on the historical Jesus, and how his life still impacts the lives of believer's today.
- **Philosophy of Religion** - *Tim Bayne* – Clear and structured overview of arguments for God, evil, and religious experience.
- **The Puzzle of God** - *Peter Vardy* – Explores the nature of God and arguments for and against His existence.
- **Arguments for God's Existence** - *Peter Vardy* – Examination of classical and modern theistic arguments.
- **The Existence of God** - *Richard Swinburne* – A rigorous probabilistic argument for God's existence.
- **Medical Ethics** - *Tony Hope* – Introduces key issues like euthanasia and autonomy.
- **Free Will** - *Thomas Pink* – Examines questions around moral responsibility.

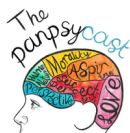

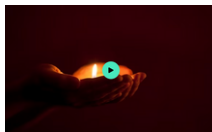
