Task one – what to write

1. MEMORY - ELIZABETH LOFTUS

 Discuss how research by Loftus might explain the convictions of innocent people for crimes they didn't commit... (HINT - eye witness testimony)

2. ATTACHMENT - JOHN BOWLBY

 Discuss how research by Bowlby might explain why young people turn to crime... (HINT – maternal deprivation)

3. SOCIAL INFLUENCE - STANLEY MILGRAM

 Discuss how research by Milgram might explain historical atrocities such as the Nazi persecution of the Jews... (HINT – obedience)

4. PSYCHOPATHOLOGY - JOHN B WATSON

 Discuss how research by Watson might explain the development of phobias of specific objects (HINT – classical conditioning)
